- A leader is a person who can put principles, plans, and policies into such dedicated and effective action that the rest of us want to back him up and help him with his job.
- A good leader originates plans and policies for the improvement of our fellowship.
- Good leadership knows that a fine plan or idea can come from anyone, anywhere.
- Good leadership often discards its own cherished plans for those that are better; giving credit to the source.
- Good leadership never passes the buck.
- (Good) leadership should always have good reasons and give them.
- Leadership is the ability to compromise cheerfully.



- (Good leadership has vision) ...the ability to make good estimates, both for the immediate and the more distant future.

As our first quarterly AWSC meeting for 2022 approaches, please take some time to look at your service position's job description and ponder "How can I become a more effective leader in this new year?" My hope for all of us is to be able to agree with Bill, "Thank God that so many of our service leaders at all levels of operation are blessed with the attributes of tolerance, responsibility, flexibility and vision."

Sometimes it took a moment to recognize each other in the flesh instead of in a tiny square on a small screen...lol! Even though I am grateful for Zoom, NOTHING can replace real human interaction.

### AREA WORLD SERVICE COMMITTEE (AWSC)

The meeting room was filled with excitement as 25 of us gathered around the table for the AWSC meeting. A good number of visitors were also present. The first thing I noticed were the number of men; six in total including new DRs for District 1 and 2. The most men I can ever remember seeing at the AWSC meeting. After reports were given by the Treasurer, Secretary, Alt. Delegate/Chair, and our Delegate, we moved on to old business.

The need for an Area Alateen Coordinator and

Area Alateen Process Person was discussed as well as a report on our "We Miss Your Face" campaign. Packets were sent to eighty-seven groups which had not participated in Assembly in recent years.

New Business covered the Proposed 2022 Budget and the Delegate's expenses to attend the 2022 World Service Conference (WSC). A KBDM was introduced to clarify the process for approving changes to the Area Guidelines. A motion was passed to add the clarifying text.

### THOUGHT FORCES

Two Thought Forces are being implemented. One is to consider the logistics of an Area Public Outreach Project to place "How Al-Anon Works" in every public library in Area 54. The other is to determine the best plan for the Spanish Translation process as well as our existing translation equipment. Both Thought Forces are to report their finding at the Spring 2022 Assembly.

### GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING (GBM)

The energy was palpable as we filled the ballroom where the GBM was to be held. 14 of our 16 districts were represented with 57 voting Group Reps present! The space was abuzz with chatter! What a great sound to hear!! Opening with the Serenity Prayer helped to center us to begin the meeting. After the

preliminaries were completed, reports given, and roll call taken, we reviewed the Rules for Discussion during a GBM.

Great news! During "Old Business", two of our members volunteered to fill the Area Alateen Coordinator and the AAPP positions. Thank you to both of the members for their willingness to serve Alateen.

New Business brought the approval of the Proposed 2022 Budget including an increase of funds for our Delegate to travel in and around Texas West Area 54. Delegate travel expenses to the 2022 WSC was also approved. Information was shared regarding the Area Guideline change and the two Thought Forces which are being implemented.

### IN ADDITION

Besides important business being addressed, we also had education, food, fun and fellowship. A fun Icebreaker and a Public Outreach Pep Rally kicked off Friday evening. Saturday and Sunday mornings, Group Reps, District Reps, and Area Coordinator workshops were held as well as one on how the KBDM process works. For members not attending the GBM, meetings were held in English and Spanish on "When I Got Busy, I Got Better". Saturday and Sunday

In 2004, the Literature Committee revised and updated the pamphlet, being careful to retain the information that members have found helpful for so many years.

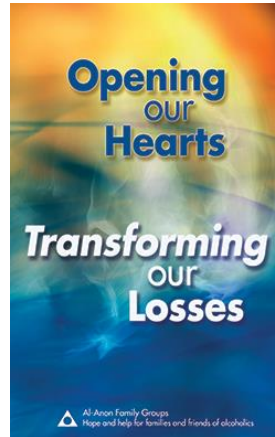

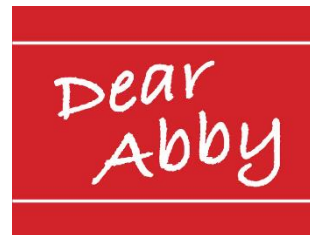
## Al-Anon in National Media
